IN THE 2010-2011 SEASON...

Miller Gallery at Carnegie Mellon University had an extraordinary season supporting the research, creation and presentation of innovative and challenging work.



AWARDS + GRANTS

- STUDIO for Creative Inquiry and Miller Gallery at CMU were awarded **\$50,000 from The Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts** in support of curatorial research leading to new scholarship in the field of contemporary art. With this fellowship, Andrea Grover was in residence last fall and directed a book sprint in the spring to collectively author a publication on the current state of art/science/technology practice. The book will be released this fall and a related exhibition will open in winter.
- Gallery Director Astria Suparak was selected for the **2010 Leadership Institute for Visual Arts Organizations**. Organized by the National Alliance for Media Art + Culture, the institute is designed to encourage and sustain visionary leadership in the arts.
- *City Paper* selected *Whatever It Takes* as Staff Pick for a **Best of Pittsburgh 2010** award.
- For the **10th year in a row**, Miller Gallery received support from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts. In 2011, director Suparak received an **Alcoa Foundation Leadership Grant for Arts Managers**.

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR EXHIBITED ARTISTS

- **2011 TED Senior Fellows** include Cesar Harada of Open_Sailing and Mitchell Joachim of TerreformONE, featured in our exhibition *29 Chains to the Moon: Artists' Schemes for a Fantastic Future*.
- **2011 Graham Foundation grant** was awarded to our *Pittsburgh Biennial* artists Sarah Ross, Ryan Griffiths, and Lize Mogel to produce a new installation premiering at the gallery this fall.
- The first **Leonore Annenberg Prize for Art and Social Change** was presented to The Yes Men, the subject of our internationally touring retrospective, *Keep It Slick: Infiltrating Capitalism with The Yes Men*.

EXHIBITIONS, EVENTS + RESIDENCIES

- Our exhibition *WHATEVER IT TAKES: Steelers Fan Collections, Rituals, and Obsessions* was featured in *The New York Times* (**#1 Most Emailed NYT sports article** for two consecutive days), selected as a *City Paper* Staff Pick for **Best Crossover Art Exhibit of 2010**, and described by *Art Papers* as a **"creative sublimation of fandom, with its inimitable rawness and verve."**
- Our exhibition *KEEP IT SLICK: Infiltrating Capitalism with The Yes Men* toured to Columbia College in Chicago and DiverseWorks Artspace in Houston. The Yes Men's first solo exhibition was dubbed **"the most prescient show of the year"** by *Paper City Magazine*, **"a timely acknowledgment of the work of ...two of the great social satirists of our time"** by *Art Papers*, and selected as a **Critic's Pick on Artforum**.
- The annual Carnegie Mellon MFA and Senior Art exhibitions, *UP DOWN UP DOWN* and *MEGA*, were organized by the School of Art and featured 40 artists at the Miller Gallery.
- We collaborated with the STUDIO for Creative Inquiry on a series of residencies: Art & Technology Residency with our *Biennial* artists R. Griffiths, S. Ross, and L. Mogel; a residency for our Warhol Foundation Fellow A. Grover; and the Art/Science/Technology Book Sprint with Grover, Régine Debatty, Claire Evans, Pablo Garcia, Jessica Young and Luke Bulman.
- We hosted the Pittsburgh live stream of the *CREATIVE TIME SUMMIT: Revolutions in Public Practice 2*.
- We co-presented *TEACH 4 AMERIKA: A Rally for a National Reconsideration of Art School* with the Bruce High Quality Foundation in partnership with the CMU School of Art and the Warhol Museum.

The Miller Gallery is always exciting, always challenging, and always at the forefront. Whenever I go to Pittsburgh, visiting the Miller Gallery is a must.
